Letter from the President



June is off to a busy start. Trout Unlimited volunteers from two different chapters spent a Saturday morning on the Tallulah River yesterday assisting the Forest Service with the annual Kid's Fishing Rodeo. Volunteers from the Rabun Chapter helped with the registration and raffle of the many prizes donated by a multitude of

sponsors. The Savannah River Chapter showed up in force and spent their time cleaning fish for the attendees and I mean lots and lots of fish. The last count I heard was approaching five hundred fish. It was a fantastic day for the almost one hundred and fifty kids who participated. Some of us even slipped away for a short time to dedicate the handicapped accessible fishing pier which was a joint project between the U. S. Forestry Service, the Rabun Chapter of Trout Unlimited, the Georgia Council of Trout Unlimited and the Georgia Department of Natural Resources Wildlife Resources Division.

This month we also held the 14th annual Georgia Trout Camp. Trout Unlimited volunteers from every chapter in the state have converged on Rabun Gap Nacoochee School for five action packed days for the twenty-four attendees, the young mentors and the grizzled veterans alike. Mike Fuller plans to resume the twice monthly trips to the Western North Carolina Fly Fishing trail after a brief interruption. Look for more details to follow soon.

I'm hoping that conditions improve overnight and that we don't get too much additional rain because as I type this I'm preparing to help other Rabunites stock Betty's Creek tomorrow morning in preparation for the inaugural fishing trip by the trout campers.

Although the stream conditions have fluctuated recently you still have a chance to get out and experience some great fishing before the summertime heat sets in. Hope to see you on the river.



of the Chattahoochee-Oconee National Forests, Ryan

Foote. Foote began his career with the Forest Service in 1999 as a seasonal Fisheries Technician on the Lassen National Forest in California. Following his graduation with a degree in Freshwater Fisheries from Humboldt State University, Foote converted to a permanent position as a Fish Biologist where he worked for the next 13 years on restoring habitat for Spring-run Chinook salmon and steelhead habitat on public lands, while supporting efforts across the forest. In 2014, Foote moved to the Idaho Panhandle National Forest, serving as the Deputy District Ranger on the Coeur d'Alene River Ranger District. He helped lead the District in large landscape res-



toration efforts, managing recreation and precious metal exploration programs, and responding to large wildfire events. Most recently, Foote served as the Acting District Ranger position on the Uwharrie National Forest in central North Carolina. Ryan comes to us on Tuesday for a great evening of Q & A with the ranger. 


6:30. Everyone welcome.




the perfect opportunity to get to know fellow chapter members and to




GITTIN' READY FOR TROUT CAMP

The 6th Annual Casting for Recovery Georgia Retreat

The 6th Casting for Recovery Georgia retreat was held May 19-21, 2017 at Smithgall Woods near Helen in the beautiful north Georgia Mountains.

Each year, fourteen Georgia women are selected via a random lottery to attend our retreat. Any woman who resides in Georgia and has received a breast cancer diagnosis is eligible to apply. Our retreats take women out of the clinical setting and into nature, where they can relax, share their cancer experience with other survivors, and learn the therapeutic sport of fly fishing. Many of the Georgia TU Chapters provide the fishing guides for the ladies. Our own Jeff Durniak has been guiding for the program each year. Also, back in March Rabun TU contributed \$1000.00 to the CFR program. Beverly Booth who heads up the Georgia CFR programs will be one of our guest speakers at a upcoming meeting in the near future. Foothills Landscape Community Collaboration

<u>Project Purpose:</u> The purpose of this project is to create, restore and maintain ecosystems that are more resilient to natural disturbances. Specifically, the Forest Service is seeking to enhance and provide quality habitat for rare and declining species, as well as desired game and non-game species; to reduce hazardous fuel loading across the landscape to diminish damaging wildfires; to improve soil and water quality; to provide sustainable recreation and access opportunities; and to awaken and strengthen a connection to these lands for all people.

The US Forest Service has been holding several meetings in North Georgia regarding this project. They are now hitting the woods ands getting started on some of the projects. They still need all of us though to stay informed and keep up the conversations online. They have started an online forum to continue discussions, start new ones, post ideas and add comments on the restoration goals, treatment locations, and methods of treatment. They also have a Facebook and Twitter page so as to keep everyone informed. Take the time to read all about this project.
