Saturday night supper had just become history and the hardy Rabunites camping in luxury at Oconee State Park in South Carolina were settling in for another evening of what they do best...sittin' by the fire, drinkin' something good and telling tales. One young Rabunite (we'll call him Justin..because that's his name) decided he'd hit the river one more time so off he went. As the evening progressed the idea was hatched to "rotate" Justin's tent 180 degrees, just to give him a different view. Cousins Monty and Shane of the English clan set off for the devious act, returning with looks of satisfaction.

Sometime later when Justin returned, the Rabunites watched with muffled laughter as Justin, with flashlight in hand, circled the tent one way, then the other, then back again. Dark Thirty and the Rabun TU Fishing Buddy List (by: Peter Croes)

A couple of months back the hatch occurred and anyone interested could contact the Dredger to be added for use of any Rabunite in search of someone to accompany them on a fishing outing . . . it's similar to Charlie's e-mail broadcast but a near-term version! It has grown to two (2) broadcasts sections thanks solely to the Dredger although its utilization should be by everyone in the Chapter so we can spend more time on the river(s).

Friday's broadcast was for a Saturday trip and I was unable to go due to contractors working at our home all day; although, Sunday while I was cooking bacon a spur-of-the-moment broadcast text hit my phone for an afternoon to Dark Thirty trip to the gorge and I was gut hooked. Hastily I packed, too much of this and not enough of what I actually needed . . . no. 16 hooks (see last month's article by the Dredger in the TU newsletter) . . . hell I can barely see the eye on 10's and 12's . . . you've got to love the spontaneity and spur of the moment fly fishing opportunities the buddy list offers!

Our meeting, and departure point, was Unicoi Outfitters where Jake helped me get the proper sizes and assortment . . . or so I thought! Durniak showed up and he immediately went to the fly section and picked out four additional patterns and told Patrick Crawford and I that we should get a couple of these as Landon had replied to the buddy list stating that the night before, at dark thirty, the fish were killing yellow sallies a couple others; and, why not . . . were at a fly shop we needed some in our fly box's. . . I just hope the one that fell on the floor got picked up by the vacuum. Have you ever looked for a #16 fly on a rug?

Upon arrival, we pulled into a cutoff and had Patrick hold the space and allow him to begin rigging while the Dredger and I drove further upstream checking out the occupancy of other prime spots in the DH section of the gorge. There were a few other anglers, we doubled back and parked behind Patrick's car, and I began the ritual of adorning the ceremonial waders, boots, and mandatory STAFF! Although the water was down the large boulders were treacherous and I did not want any semblance of a re-occurrence of last fall on The River with Jim Kidd and Wayne Prosser down around Sawmill Hole . . . I came prepared and had my knee braces on! I tied on a Cahill, went down the bank, and was in the water fishing . . . 15' from the car. They were there but not in any mood to hit, at least not at that time of day . . . even the Dredger was getting three refusals to every hook set; and then, later, the stillness of the running water was broken by a WAAaaaaaaaaaa HOOOooooooo as the Dredger hooked a 15" Brown!

We continued fishing, losing occasional sight of each and the other anglers began to drift back toward civilization, after all of the trout have eaten and nothing happens in the late afternoon! I worked my way back upstream to where we were parked and Patrick was preparing to leave to drive back to Lawrenceville . . . with a good excuse, he had to be at work at 03:00 . . . he had caught a nice trout and was happy. I continued fishing and caught some nice browns.

Later on the Dredger came back to the car indicating that I needed to come up the bank as we were going to a honey hole he had found and wanted me to make a few casts; of course under his tutelage. I made a few and missed a few of the subtle strikes; and tangled the bushes behind me trying to correct a lousy hook set and/or cast! Some of those tangles would make a goat roper happy with his work.

On one of the takes, I used my Tarpon hook set so if you catch the big brown with a protruding lip or is speaking with a lisp he just might be the one the VolFish pulled out of the water on the hookset! When we were finished working the near runs we went upstream a little ways and worked the far side where the gooduns were . . . WAAaaaaa HOOOoooo! The hatch began to occur and the switch turned on, one emerger even made it to about an inch off the surface before a rising trout ruint his day; then about 8:10 the switch went off and it was time to hit the bank and prepare to leave and feed ourselves . . . the nearest open chow line was in Murphy!

If you are not on the Rabun TU Buddy List I suggest you sign up . . . who cares who shows up just go with anyone who shows and enjoy the river with a fishing buddy . . . you might learn something or be able to impart your skills and fly fishing expertise on someone who will in turn pass it on and protect our waters; and by the way, my camera battery was dead although the fishing was good and the catching even better!

TU NATIONAL PAYS RESPECT

Art Neumann, the last of the original founders of Trout Unlimited, passed away Monday, March 21. He was 99 years old.

Those of us who answered the call of conservation, can quote Leopold, Pinchot, Carson, and any other number of other conservation visionaries. Lesser known is the legacy of Art Neumann.

Art wasn't much for the catchy quote, though his adage, "take care of the fish and the fishing will take care of itself," guides Trout Unlimited a half century later. What Art did was to build an institution—an institution that began with him and a handful of other people along the banks of the Au Sable River, who were tired of the state's masking habitat degradation through stocking.

Today, the "house that Art built" includes 400 chapters, over 155,000 members, and 240 scientists, biologists, and other professional staff who serve to make fishing, and the places that fish live, better.

A month or so ago, I saw Art in Michigan with, Chris Radke and Howard Johnson. Chris and Howard represent the thousands of people in Michigan and around the country who will tirelessly carry on Art's legacy in service to the rivers, fish, anglers, kids, veterans and communities that define our great nation.

Thanks and rest in peace, Art.
