Status Update - Chattooga North Fork Visitor Use Capacity Analysis

On January 31, 2012 the Forest Supervisors of the Sumter, Chattahoochee and Nantahala National Forests issued Final decisions notices for Alternative 13A. http://www.fs.usda.gov/detail/scnfs/home/?cid=STELPRDB5253595

Boating will be permitted on the Chattooga North Fork beginning December 1 through April 30 every year, on any day the flow reaches 350 cfs on the Burrell's Ford gauge. http://waterdata.usgs.gov/nwis/uv?02176930

Boating is NOT permitted on approximately 4 miles between just below Lick Log Creek and the Highway 28 Bridge.

The boaters have filed a federal court case demanding year-round unrestricted access at any flow. A hearing is tentatively scheduled for February 2013 and a final decision on the case is expected in March 2013.

Fly Fishing Tips for Catching Winter Trout

Winter can be the most rewarding season of the year for fly anglers. If you can stand the cold, you just might have the river to yourself, experiencing solitude that's rarely found when the mayflies are hatching in spring and summer. But there's another reason to get out and fish between December and March: Winter can also be the most technically challenging season, demanding precision and skill more than any other time of the year. If you can catch fish now, you can catch them any time.

The trick to catching fish with flies in the winter boils down to four simple rules: Slow Down; Size Down; Tone Down; Present Down(stream).

Did You Make It To The Chattooga This Weekend? By Jimmy Harris



If you did, you experienced spring-like weather, black stoneflies, 52 degree water and, overall, just a great day to be on one of the most beautiful rivers in the country. We didn't rush to get there early, left Cornelia around 10:30 Saturday morning for a leisurely ride north. We were fishing a little after 12 noon. The South Carolina parking lot at the DH was almost full; we got the last spot and assumed the river would be full of anglers. Turns out there were several anglers up and down the river but it certainly was not crowded at all.



Hey, anyone can hook a fish in the mouth!

About 1:00 the little black stones began flying around, touching the surface now and then but rises were few and far between. The rains from Friday had pushed the Hwy. 76 gauge up just barely over 2 feet but by the time we stepped in the river it was probably around 1.95' and dropping. The water was stained but not muddy at all. It almost had a tannin stained appearance to it. We briefly discussed whether or not the stain was preventing the fish from keying in on the stones but then decided it really didn't matter. We were happy dredging and steadily catching fish.

I did manage several fish on a small black soft hackle but they wouldn't touch a black stonefly nymph. A glass bead pheasant tail nymph with copper wire wrapped around the body was productive early on but eventually quit producing. All the small flies I tried were dropped off behind a Pat's Rubber Legs and a few fish took it through the afternoon.

Enough that I never took it off and my big fish of the day (this nice brown in the photo) was compliments of Mr. Pat. Just before hooking this nice fish, I had noticed an angler upstream who appeared to be in a wild battle with a good fish. Later as he walked by I asked if he had caught a nice fish. He told me it was about a 20" brown...on a Pat's Rubber Legs. Big fly, big fish!

My fishing buddy Jeff was dredging most of the day as was I but he decided to return on Sunday with his 3 wt. and fish nothing but dry/dropper rigs. The little black stones were coming off again after lunch and he had steady success. He also reported that the water was clearing from the rains so maybe the stain did have something to do with it.

It's raining almost every day this week and things are expected to turn colder but this is prime time on the Chattooga DH. If you can get away, and the water level is 2 feet or less, you need to plan a trip there. And you may want to pack some Pat's Rubber Legs.

Notes from the Prez Why should you attend the Rendezvous?

For the 26th year the Rabun Chapter will host the famous "**RABUN RENDEZVOUS**", to be held on February 2, 2013 at the Dillard House Conference Center, Dillard, GA. Along with a buffet meal, a program speaker and great bluegrass music, we will have a silent auction, bucket raffle and a door prize.

Our Chapter is committed to protecting and improving the cold-water fisheries in our area and supporting other chapters in their efforts. However it takes funds to provide the support, equipment, and expenses of these activities. The annual Rabun Rendezvous is our main source of funds for the work.

Last year our Chapter raised over fifteen thousand dollars at the Rabun Rendezvous, all of which went into projects to support the mission of TU.

Here are some examples of the activities we accomplished with the funds received from last year's Rendezvous: Financial support for GA Council Trout Unlimited Youth Trout Camp, held annually at Rabun Gap-Nacoochee School; Sponsorship of student interns working in Northeast GA cold-water fisheries program with the GA Department of Natural Resources and the US Forest Service; Sponsoring two youngsters to attend the Trout Unlimited Youth Trout Camp; Financial support of the GA Department of Natural Resources Smithgall Woods Conservation Education Program; Financial support for the Kid's Fishing Event at Tallulah River (US Forest Service); Financial support for the University of Georgia's Coldwater Research Endowment Fund; Funding for the construction of a handicap accessible fishing pier on the Tallulah River; Financial support for the Rabun County Middle School mentoring program; Equipment and manpower for the Chattooga River clean-up day; In-stream habitat improvement workday with USFS on a Rabun County brook trout stream; Financial support for Casting For Recovery and Fly Fishing for Vets Wounded Warriors Program; Financial support for National TU's First Cast, Embrace-A-Stream, & Southeast Lands programs; Financial support for the GA Council Trout Unlimited Back-the-Brookie program; Operation of Rabun TU's award winning website and Face Book page; and Trout Magazine subscriptions to all school & public libraries and two State Parks in Rabun County.
