Prince Nymph

I CANNOT SAY ENOUGH ABOUT THIS FLY. I LOVE TO TRAIL THIS BEHIND A STIMULATOR, BUT BE SURE YOU TIE THESE WITH NO WEIGHT IF YOU ARE GOING TO USE IT AS AN EMERGER. IF NOT, TIE IT WITH WEIGHT AND DREDGE THE BOTTOM.

Hook: Nymph size 10 to 16 Thread: Red or Black Tail: Brown Goose Biots Wings: White Goose Biots Body: Peacock Herl - Ribbed with Gold Wire or Tinsel Hackle: Brown



June 18 (Tues) Chapter Meeting – 25 folks were in attendance **Program:** "From Two Inches to Ten Pounds, the Wild Browns of the Hooch Tailwater" by Patrick O'Rouke, Fisheries Biologist with the GA WRD.

Patrick gave an excellent PowerPoint presentation about the study of the wild brown trout in the Chattahoochee tailwater below Lake Lanier. The stocking of browns was stopped in 2005, but the brown trout density has been maintained by wild browns. An extended brown trout study was conducted to determine wild brown trout growth, movement and diet. 4,288 browns were captured at 4 stations. 2,388 were tagged and 583 were recaptured during the 14 month study to establish their rate of growth. The study determined that the browns didn't migrate. Most of the browns stay on an insect diet and are in the 8 to 12 inch size range. A few switch over to feed on fish and they are the few that grow to larger size like the one in the picture.



The study was conducted by a partnership between GA WRD, NPS, TU Embrace-A-Stream, volunteers from 4 TU Chapters, The Chattahoochee Riverkeeper and The Chattahoochee Coldwater Fishery Foundation.
