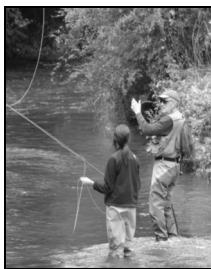
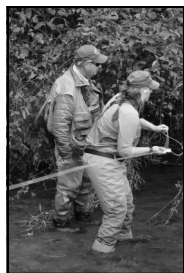

**Jim and Carolyn Kidd spent some time late this summer in the high mountains of Colorado. Based on Carolyn's photo looks like the fishing was pretty good .**

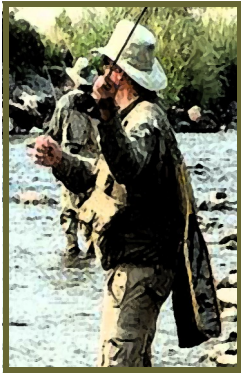

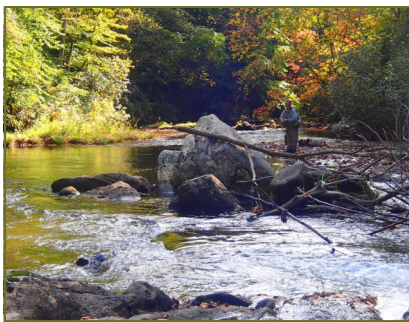

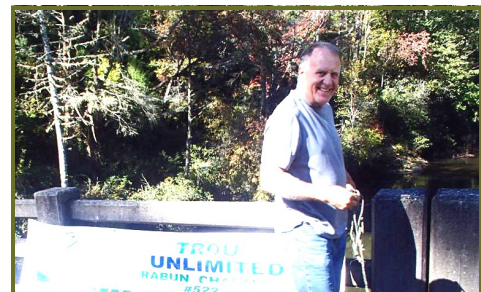

### East State to observe milestone

East State Plumbing is celebrating 45 years of serving Toccoa-Stephens County this month.

The company will observe the anniversary with a customer appreciation event Thursday, Sept. 26, from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the East State facility at 95 Design Point off Rose Lane.

Owner Jimmy Whiten, who has more than 50 years of experience as a plumber, started the business in September, 1968.

"I started plumbing in the summer of 1961, working part-time while I was in school and full time in the summer months," Whiten said.

"I worked for Frank Payne of Toccoa Plumbing and Heating Works. Then I served two years in the Army and after I left the Army, I opened East State Plumbing," he said.

East State Plumbing is a full service operation —

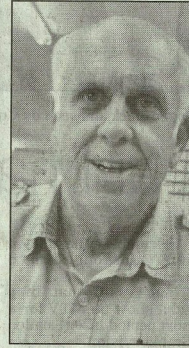
commercial, new houses, camera inspections, drain cleaning, back flow work and repair work.

In the beginning, it was a one man operation.

"It did not take me long to realize that I could not do it all my myself. I needed help and I hired my first helper. Over the years I have had the help of a number of plumbers and helpers. Later on, I hired someone to work in the office. Still later I opened a plumbing store with the help of two women — Rita Cantrell and Karen Rogers — who have been working for me for 26 years," Whiten said.

Over the last 50 years Whiten said he's seen plenty of changes in the plumbing business.

"Most people are familiar with the changes in types of piping, from cast iron and galvanized to copper and plastics, but there are many more changes including the new power tools, special-

ty tools, all of the water saving devices, low consumption water closets, water saving faucets and more energy efficient water heaters," Whiten said. He also noted the many

changes to the plumbing code, the number of different certificates a plumber must attain and the continuing education needed to keep one's plumber's license updated.

Whiten said there are a few good people who have been the secret to his 45-year business success.

"My wife, Doris, my daughter, Denise, good employees, loyal customers and their support and understanding have all been factors in my success," he said.

Whiten addressed a often-asked question of his retirement.

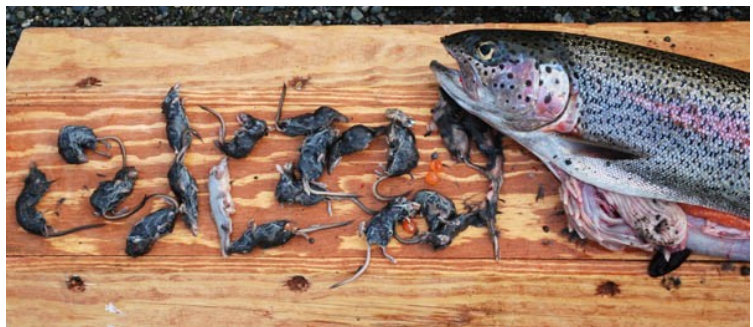
"I have slowed down some. I have good, qualified people working for me. Lots of our customers are third generation and I want to continue to fulfill their plumbing needs for the future. My wife and I have taken a number of six-week extended vacations since 2005. I have no plans for full time retirement at this time," he said.

**Congratulations to Charlie Breithaupt on his article about our Georgia Trout Camp making the TU National Magazine in the Action line Section.**



...it is, it is another old water spring that help carry it through hot summer days. The biggest problem is erosion, which we hope to improve.

The overall goal of this project is the introduction of the once native eastern brook trout to the Chattahoochee River. The project will also reduce sedimentation and nutrient flow to the Chattahoochee River. The project comes at an estimated cost of approximately \$100,000.

This project is part of a long-term restoration effort of the Chattahoochee and its watershed. TU's higher priority restoration strategy is to start at the headwaters and work downstream. The Chattahoochee River in Helen, GA.

The Chattahoochee River is managed by United Outfitters, Owner Jerry Harts, a dedicated and generous steward of TU, invited participants to fish and anglers anglers. All 24 camps were able to fish at the same time with mentors by their side.

It was an exciting day for all. As always, the hard-working partners of the Trout Camp and Georgia DNR supported camp operations in every way. This Camp would not happen without them.

This was the 10th year of Trout Camp. New volunteers showed up and some helped. All important roles, and more "new blood" is important if we want this camp to continue. All involved believe this is a good way to ensure the future and "pass on" the love of cold water and trout fishing, especially fly fishing.

Georgia Trout Camp is a 14-day wide camp at all 13 chapters and camps. Camps being actively involved in the Trout Camp next year. You will experience a sense of pride and achievement and probably learn something. The best way to learn is to teach... especially a kid.

**Council helps repair damage caused by Super Storm Sandy**  
MASSACHUSETTS/ RHODE ISLAND

The Mass./RI Council holds its annual meeting in May on the banks of the Westfield River in Chesterfield, Mass., at the US Army Corps of Engineers Indian Hollow Campground. This year's event took on special meaning as the Council's 13 Chapters received an appeal for help in repairing a portion of the stream bank

that was heavily damaged by Hurricane Sandy flooding from the ACES Indian Hollow Park manager just prior to their scheduled weekend. TU volunteers quickly rallied by securing 225 other volunteers for planting, with over 100 volunteers available to help. The Mass./RI Council had representatives from each chapter getting their hands dirty installing the rip-rap armchairs in the damaged zone. Many hands make quick work, and volunteers accomplished the task in a short two hours. These efforts have been praised by ACES staff and the Chesterfield Conservation Commission and the Council is looking forward to next year's meeting to start the progress of this bank stabilization project.

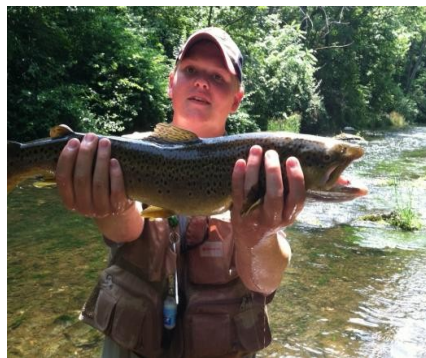

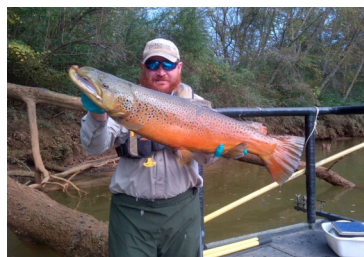

# Notes from the President

## GEORGIA'S SECOND SEASON

The changing from summer to autumn seasons bring many delights: colorful hardwood leaves, blooming wildflowers along fields and roads, cool nights and warm days. And it starts a new and exciting time for trout fishing in Georgia, the Delayed Harvest season.

Delayed Harvest (DH) is a popular management strategy designed to provide a high quality catch-and-release trout fishery from fall through spring, after which the stream is opened for harvest under general regulations. Because each trout can be caught more than once, catch rates remain high over long periods of time. High catch rates are further assured by periodic restocking to replace trout lost to injury or natural mortality.

The Delayed Harvest season begins annually on Nov 1 (all day) and ends May 14 (all day). We are very fortunate that one of the DH streams is located on a section of the Chattooga River, from the GA Hwy 28 Bridge upstream to the mouth of Reed Creek. Other DH streams in Georgia include sections of Amicalola Creek, Smith Creek, the Chattahoochee River and the Toccoa River.

The Georgia Department of Natural Resources is to be commended for this excellent program. I'll see you on the river!

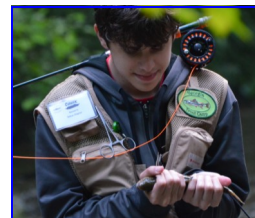
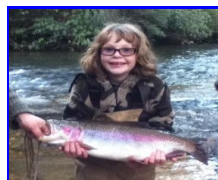
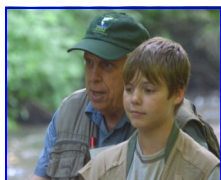
