#### **Fishing Reports from THE RIVER**

Editor's Notes: At the 2013 Rendezvous, Pat Hopton offered on Silent Auction to go DARK-30 fishing with one person in the Chattooga Upper Backcountry. Following are 3 reports (the trip sold 3 times at the high bid price) filed by Mr. Dark-30 (Pat Hopton).



**TRIP #1**: On Tuesday 5/14 Peter Croess and I went into the Chattooga Upper Backcountry for a "Dark Thirty" fishing trip. The fishing was great, the catching was slow. We both had one LDR, none brought to hand. We saw some rising fish, but could not fool them. Saw very small cream caddis and sporadic small light cahills. I fished the Yonah Shunga Pool and Peter fished the Side Pockets. Water temp was 54 and the level was still up, but wadable with caution. We saw no fairies on the hike out. The best part of the trip was the Cuban sandwiches that Peter brought! Although no fish were caught, it was still a good trip. I would fish with Peter any time. He's great company, full of stories, and I was especially impressed when he picked up trash on the hike out. Thanks, Peter, for the memories.



**TRIP #2:** On Wednesday 5/15 evening Neal McEwen and I went on our "Dark Thirty" fishing trip. Considering the slow catching from the previous evening, we decided not to make a long hike into the backcountry. We started at the Riffle Pool, where Neal promptly landed a nice rainbow trout. We worked our way up to the Yonah Shunga Pool, where Neal spent the evening while I fished the lower end of the Side Pockets. Unfortunately, that one rainbow was the only catching that happened. We saw very few insects coming off the water. A few light cahills and a few caddis, but not nearly what I would have expected. We had a brief 15-30 minute period of rising fish around 8:00 but it was very sporadic. I can't explain why the bugs and fish weren't seen, except that maybe someone forgot to turn the switch on last night. Three highlights of the trip: Neal and I both took a swim while crossing the river at dark. The river is still swift and the recent high water has changed the crossings somewhat. It made for a wet and cold walk out. The hike out was improved when we saw the fairies. And we were treated to seeing a nice black bear on Warwoman Road on the drive home! I had a great time, Neal. I wish the catching would have been better.



**TRIP #3:** On Sunday 5/19 evening Scott James and I went on our "Dark Thirty" fishing trip. Considering the high and murky water (340 cfs @ Burrell's Ford gauge), we decided not to make a long hike into the backcountry. We started at the Side Pockets, where Scott promptly landed a nice wild brown trout. We worked our way up to the Jay Bird Pool, where we spent the evening. The catching total was Scott 1 wild brown, Pat 2 wild browns and 1 wild chum. Scott got his on a 2 nymph rig under a strike indicator and I got mine on a small yellow stimulator. We saw a lot of insects coming off the water. A few light cahills and a few caddis, lots of yellow sallies and even a few sulphur mayflies. We had a brief 15-30 minute period of rising fish around 8:00 but it was very sporadic. No green drakes. There was no dark-30 action. I had a great time, Scott. I wish the catching would have been better.

## It's Dark Thirty Time Again!

After a long, cool spring we have finally arrived at "Dark Thirty" time again. What is Dark Thirty time, you ask?

It begins in that season of year when the river temperatures are getting up to the mid-60's... the long evenings are warm and dry.... and the bugs start hatching off in the evenings. Dark Thirty is the magical time of day when the sun goes down; it is late evening to after dark fishing. It is when the mayfly spinners come down to lay their eggs and the fish come out to feed.

The highlight of the Dark Thirty season is the Green Drake mayfly hatch. These bugs are huge! They are a mouthful for the fish and it is one of the few times of the year here in North Georgia when big brown trout make the mistake to come up to feed on the surface of the water.
