STATE RECORD BROWN TROUT CAUGHT



Chad Doughty, age 27, of Winder hooked and "battled" the new state record brown trout for about 45 minutes while kayak fishing on the Chattahoochee River below Buford Dam on July 27. Doughty, using a rooster tail with spinning tackle on 6 lb line, even had to abandon his kayak to "run down" the fish as his spinning reel almost ran out of line.

According to the Georgia Department of Natural Resources' Wildlife Resources Division, this 20 lb, 14 oz, 31 ½" catch beat the existing state record, established in 2001 by 2 lb, 8 oz. Aug 28 (Thurs) Monthly BOD Meeting at the TU/Scout Hut. Meeting starts at 6:30; all are welcome!!


Sept 13 (Sat) Quarterly Georgia TU State Council Meeting. Macon Chapter will be hosting from 9 am to noon.


Casting for Recovery



Thank you to all who helped make the Family Picnic a success: Claude Dillard for the use of the park, everyone that brought food, and Mack Martin and Gar-





STREAM SHOCKING 2014 Despite its leader, General M.E. Seehorn, being confined to a MASH unit to nurse his bum knee, our battalion of natural resource agency staffers and volunteers carried on its mission. We assembled on the banks of the Chattooga in mid-July for the annual electrofishing sample of the river's fish community. The Spoon Auger (Burrells Ford) site was tackled this year via a three-pass depletion and the usual cast of critters was captured: wild browns, stocked trout, minnows, sculpins, chubs, suckers, and darters. Hundreds of finned POW's were identified to species, counted, weighed, and returned alive to the river.


SCDNR staff will summarize the data, do some computer magic, and report the results, as always, via pretty graphs and charts at the annual Chattooga Fisheries Coalition Meeting in February. The estimates of fish density (numbers) and biomass (pounds) will add to the historic database of the upper Chattooga. The health of the river fish community and sport fishery has been assessed since 1986.

Special thanks to the following sampling platoons: GA and SC wildlife agencies, the National Forests of GA, SC, and NC, students from several GA and SC colleges, and TUers from both banks of the river. Sampling coordinator Leon "Ditka" Brotherton gave our massive shocker skirmish line a thumbs up!

The battalion also wishes to salute USFS fisheries biologist Jeannie Riley, who has survived these samples long enough to successfully retire this fall. Thanks Jeannie! We'll miss you.




