It was a good day of hard work, cooperation and camaraderie. Thanks to all the volunteers and the folks at Lake Burton Hatchery. We made the fishing better!








Sportsman's Day at the State Capitol

Georgia fishermen and fisherwomen were well represented by the Georgia State Council of Trout Unlimited in January on Sportsman's day at the State Capitol. The Rabun Chapter had two members in attendance.

Annual Chattooga Coalition Meeting was held on Feb 4, 2014.

DNR reported on the trout stocking program and gave information reported to them from their online angler diary program. In the online report GA anglers accounted for about 87% of the total reports and Rabun anglers accounted for 24% of that total. The report showed that approximately 77,000 trout were stocked into the Chattooga River in 2013. The delayed harvest section was the most popular fishing destinations for anglers who reported online. Catch data was down about 20% from 2012. Storms and high water probably contributed to the decline. In summary the online diary does provide useful information at a very affordable cost that improves the understanding of the fishing pressure, catch and angler use patterns. Greater participation in the online diary should be promoted and encouraged.

The Annual Planning Meeting was held on Saturday, Feb 8, 2014 at the Dillard House. Rabunite members ate a fabulous Dillard House breakfast then got right to work planning out the 2014 agenda. Monies were budgeted out and allocated to our events that promote our mission and we set the calendar for FY 2014. The Chapter has a total of \$35,966 available before expenditures.

The results of the 2014 Budgeted Expenditure Planning are as follows:

CHAPTER OPERATIONS - \$4,900 (Includes: newsletter, website, annual planning breakfast, memorials, equipment, administrative supplies, meeting expenses, postage)


YOUTH & EDUCATION - \$10, 785 (Includes: funding for up to 4 kids to attend the 3013 GA Trout Camp, Smithgall Woods Youth Education Program, UGA Graduate Level Coldwater Research Endowment, Project Healing Waters for Wounded Warriors, GA DNR Outdoor Adventure Day at Unicoi State Park, Casting for Recovery, Kids Fishing Event with US Forest Service at Tallulah River, 5 gift TROUT magazine subscriptions to libraries and state parks in Rabun County, gift TU memberships for Stream Explorers and others, Rabun County Middle School Mentoring, Boy Scouts Merit Badges in Fly Fishing.)

CONSERVATION PROJECTS - \$7,700 (Includes: Tallulah River Clean-up, Funding for College Interns Working in Wild Trout Habitat Enhancement with GA WRD, In-stream Volunteer Workday, Stream Project with US Forest Service, Construct Handicap Access for Tallulah River. NOTE – the backcountry helicopter stocking of the Chattooga North and West Forks will be funded by the donations made to the Tom Landreth Memorial Fund)

NATIONAL PROGRAMS - \$4,000 (Includes: the Youth Education Initiative, Southeastern Land Protection Coordinator, Embrace-A-Stream program & the Cold Water Conservation Fund) TU OUTREACH.

OTHER - \$3,700 (Contingency Fund)

Total 2014 Budget: \$31,085

Notes from the President

What's Ahead?

In last month's Prez Notes I gave a short report on the accomplishment of the 27th annual Rabun Rendezvous, including a report on how much money was raised and how those funds will be spent. In that column, I said those funds will allow us to continue and build upon the good work already being accomplished by the Rabun Chapter. In addition, I alluded that we have planned several new ventures in 2014 to further our mission. I would like to take this opportunity to let you know of some of those ventures.

During my term as Chapter President, the Board of Directors has consistently supported an emphasis on youth outreach. From bringing Franklin Tate, TU's National Youth Outreach Director, to be the guest speaker at the 26th annual Rendezvous, to providing support to local Scout Troops, to assisting with Kid's Fishing Events, the Chapter has already done great work in youth outreach. Now the Rabun Chapter is furthering that commitment to youth by sponsoring a Trout in the Classroom project at the Rabun County Primary School. Trout in the Classroom is an environmental education program in which students in grades k-12 raise trout from eggs to fry, monitor tank water quality, engage in stream habitat study, learn to appreciate water resources, begin to foster a conservation ethic, grow to understand ecosystems. Most programs end the year by releasing their trout in a state-approved stream near the school or within a nearby watershed. The Chapter contact for this program is Jerry McFalls. Next, the Rabun Chapter, in conjunction with the Foothills Chapter, will support our wounded veteran's through Project Healing Waters. Project Healing Waters Fly Fishing, Inc. is dedicated to the physical and emotional rehabilitation of disabled active military service personnel and disabled veterans through fly fishing and associated activities including education and outings. Finally, the Rabun Chapter has begun a new and exciting outreach to women anglers and conservationists.
