The month wrapped up with the Kid's Fishing Event on the Tallulah River. Volunteers from the Rabunites were joined by members of the Savannah River Chapter who once again cleaned several hundred trout for the youngsters. Thanks to the Forest Service for once again organizing and putting on this highly popular event.

Summer takes on a little slower pace as far as trout fishing opportunities go with the lower stream flows and higher water temperatures, but determined fishermen can still find enough action to keep them occupied. The Rabunites are not beyond targeting other fresh and/or salt water species which are more cooperative in the warmer conditions. Bristol Bay and the beautiful Naknek River will once again play hosts to some Rabunites as they take on monster rainbow trout, grayling, silver salmon and possibly some sockeye and king salmon as an added bonus. Watch out for the bears guys as you will spend one day fishing the Brooks River in Katmai National Park. Brown bears abound in the park during the summer as they gather to take advantage of the sockeye salmon spawning runs.
