#### **Griffiths Gnat**

Hook: #16-20 Dry Fly Hook

**Body: Single Strand Peacock Heal** 

Body Hackle: Grizzly Hackle (size it to hook)



Use this during the winter months if you see midges hatching. It's a great fly to use on slow moving, calm water.

# **Back Casting**

Tuesday, Oct 16 — Rabun Chapter Monthly Meeting

Aproximately 30 Rabun Chapter members and guests attended the monthly meeting. We heard a presentation from Mike Worley, CEO of the Georgia Wildlife Federation. Mr Worley provided much information about the Georgia Outdoor Stewardship Amendment, which will be presented on the ballot as Amendment One on Nov 6.

Following the presentation we had a raffle of various items. The amount raised was \$93.00. Thank you to everyone who donated items and who bought raffle tickets!





# **Georgia Outdoor Stewardship Amendment**

The Georgia Outdoor Stewardship Amendment is on the ballot on November 6 as Amendment One. This is the first time Georgians have had a chance to dedicate funding for conservation and it can be done without a tax increase.

The amendment will allow up to 80% of the existing sales and use tax on outdoor sporting goods to the protection of the state's land, water and wildlife with no new taxes or fees. Over \$20 million would be dedicated every year for the next ten years.

This funding could not be used for any other purpose and would be subject to strict accountability provisions and public disclosure. Only projects consistent with the state's established goals for conservation would be approved.

If passed, this funding would:

- Protect lands critical to clean drinking water and the quality of Georgia's lakes, rivers and streams;
- Acquire and improve parks and trails;
- Maintain and improve access to wildlife management areas and create opportunities for hunting and fishing; and
- Support Georgia's \$27 billion outdoor recreation industry.

The Georgia Outdoor Stewardship Amendment is supported by a coalition of leading conservation organizations including The Conservation Fund, Georgia Conservancy, Georgia Wildlife Federation, The Nature Conservancy, Park Pride, and The Trust for Public Land.

Campsite #93 in the "Wooded Loop" will be the official gathering site. Campsites fill up fast this time of year, so don't delay in making your campsite reservations (see below).





WHEN: Saturday, January 19, 2019. Please note change of date from previous years.

WHERE: The Dillard House Conference Center, located behind the Dillard House Restaurant in Dillard, GA.

WHO: The more the better! Everyone interested in conserving and protecting our cold-water resources, including their families, friends, and all who love cold streams, trout, and trout fishing.

SOCIAL: **Doors open at 3:00 pm.** Around 4:30 pm folks will start gathering to "pick the pig" and enjoy the rocking chairs on the porch of the Conference Center. There will snack trays of chees, crackers, veggies with dip, and fruit. Soft drinks and ice will available. 

#### My First Trip to the Nantahala DH. Submitted by Brian Weeks, October 25, 2018

Soon after the opening of the North Carolina DH season, I took my first trip to the Nantahala. I've heard plenty of good things from fellow anglers about the river through the years, but have never visited there until mid-last week. And I must say, that is one pretty stream.

The weather and water conditions were just about as good as one could ask for. Highs in the upper seventies, cloudy, with a slight tinge to the 62F wadeable water. The leaves on the trees signaled the advent of fall as they were just barely beginning to change color. And, for those that haven't been yet, the Nantahala offers a bountiful amount of bank-to-bank fishable water with plenty of runs, pockets, riffles, eddies, and pools.

This relaxing and beautiful setting made the fishing all the more refreshing and pleasurable. A 20+ day with both rainbows and browns, both wilds and stocked. And two good sized stocked brookies to round out a slam. The wild rainbows and browns were smaller, but made up for their size with their pretty colors. And with one of the brookies a half an inch shy of a foot long and, despite being a stocker, the other taking first place in beauty for the day with its fall colors on full display, they were the highlights of the trip.

Will I be back? God willing. My only question is, what took me so long in the first place?



#### Alaska Fishing Report, August 2018—Submitted by Brad Tucker, Oct 29, 2018

Sid Berkstresser and I took advantage of the chapter discount to fish with the Naknek River Camp in King Salmon, Alaska. We got there on a slow week with only a handful of other fishers in camp. Most of the fishing was of the chuck and duck variety with beads in the Naknek. Though late in the season, the sockeyes were still running. We had a great time catching those by wading just off the river banks, and for the first time, I had a fish take me into my backing. We also caught kings, Dolly Vardens, big rainbows, and arctic char, mostly on beads. There was also some dry fly action for grayling, which was a lot of fun. Of course, the scenery was magnificent, just beyond description. We got to see several brown bears and took one fly-out. While the accommodations at the lodge are fairly basic, the food was great. It's a trip we won't soon forget.
