Chapter Meeting October 15, 2019

A very large turn-out of Rabun Chapter members and guests were at the monthly Chapter meeting to hear Ryan Foote and Robbie Sitlzar, District Rangers of the USFS Chattooga River and Andrew Pickens Districts respectively, speak on the "Summary of the Upper Chattooga River Recreation Monitoring Study Report" and "Update on Forest Service Activities within the Chattooga River Watershed".

This study synthesizes a two-year monitoring effort of recreation uses, including hiking, backpacking, fishing, and boating, within the Wild & Scenic River section located upstream of GA Hwy 28.

The report is meant to assess current recreational management strategies, as well as guide future Forest Service decisions regarding this amazing natural resource.



COST: \$35 for adults and \$25 for youth age 15 and younger. Cash, check, VISA or MasterCard are accepted. Pay at the door when you arrive.



The Georgia Delayed Harvest trout season begins Nov 1 and the Chattooga River should be well-stocked by the time of our campout. Yee Haa!!!


Campsite #93 in the "Wooded Loop" will be the official gathering site. Campsites fill up fast this time of year, so don't delay in making your campsite reservations (see below).
