



WHEN: Saturday, January 18, 2020.

WHERE: The Dillard House Conference Center, located behind the Dillard House Restaurant in Dillard, GA.

WHO: The more the better! Everyone interested in conserving and protecting our cold-water resources, including their families, friends, and all who love cold streams, trout, and trout fishing.

SOCIAL: Doors open at 3:00 pm. Around 4:30 pm folks will start gathering to “pick the pig” and enjoy the rocking chairs on the porch of the Conference Center. There will snack trays of cheese, crackers, veggies with dip, and fruit. Soft drinks and ice will available. There will be a nice fire inside to warm your buns. *Please note the earlier start time from previous years.*

The Foxfire Boys will again provide their ‘down home’ style of bluegrass picking and singing for your enjoyment from 5:00 to 6:30 pm. CD’s will be available for purchase.

Raffle and silent auction items will be available for your chance of purchase. We welcome donations of raffle and auction items!

DINNER: Fish, chicken, beef, and pork with all the side dishes and desserts that have made the Dillard House famous will be served at 6:30 pm. It is a serve yourself buffet and you will not leave hungry!

Please note there will be no guest speaker this year. For this reason, we anticipate concluding the Rendezvous at an earlier time than previous years.

COST: \$35 for adults and \$25 for youth age 15 and younger. Cash, check, VISA or MasterCard are accepted. Pay at the door when you arrive.

LODGING: The Dillard House has set special rates for rooms starting at \$79 (plus tax) for those that make reservation and say they are attending the Trout Unlimited Rabun Rendezvous.




Fishing the "Big D"

The week before Christmas, I enjoyed a solo trip to the Davidson River near Brevard, NC for a day. With a four hour drive ahead of me, I made sure I woke up early enough (2:30AM) to help ensure a full day of fishing. After brushing my teeth and combing my hair, I was in the truck and on the road at 3AM. At 7AM I pulled in the hatchery parking lot.

As one might expect, given the cold night before (low of 36F) and cold morning water (40F), the parking lot wasn't busy. In fact, other than the federal nature center worker's truck, I was the only one in the parking lot.

After gearing up (yes, I wore waders), I made my way down to the chilly water at the bridge and began to nymph my way up to the hatchery exit water pipe. I had on two flies, the smallest being the point fly - a #18 gray WD40. I had the entire hatchery section, which is not stocked, to myself. But, despite my best efforts in this short stretch, including light tippet, multiple fly changes and stealthy long leader casts, I came up completely dry.

I then decided to drop downstream a ways to fish some less pressured, but still unstocked, water and that's when things started to pick up. The water temp at its peak hit a balmy 41F in mid-afternoon.

All in all, I was able to manage 10-12 to the net. The most notable included a 14" wild brown with a pretty deep yellow belly. No 20+" fish, and no big numbers, but still an enjoyable day on the Big D.




