RABUN RENDEZVOUS - 2022

A Plan to Re-Open the Rabun Chapter!

Many people have been asking when the Rabun Chapter will resume in-person meetings and activities. During last month's Board of Directors meeting the following Plan was approved to phase in these meetings and activities.

Rabun TU Phased In Meeting Proposal:

Purpose: Provide guidelines for return to Rabun TU meetings and events. Emphasis on a) following state, TU national, and facility Covid guidelines and b) personal responsibility and decision-making.

All meetings will have the following requirements:

- 1. Each participant will be responsible for checking current Covid numbers and local transmission status to determine their personal risk and make their individual decision regarding event participation.
- 2. All participants will fill out contact tracing forms. Liability forms will be completed for each event. These forms will be filed and kept by the vice-president.
- 3. The designated event leader will be responsible for providing hand sanitizer, masks, liability and contact tracing forms, clean pens and basket for used pens, and any necessary cleaning supplies. The chapter will pay for those supplies.
- 4. Event leaders will follow host facility guidelines, state and TU national guidelines. Unvaccinated participants will be asked to wear a mask.
- 5. Event leaders will clean equipment and furniture used, as appropriate at the end of the chapter event.

Phase I: Starting December 1, 2021

Small group meetings and individual participation in larger groups will be allowed with the restriction/guidelines in this document. Consultation before the event with either the chapter President or Vice-presidents is recommended.

- 1. <u>Chapter Small Group:</u> (Max=6) of members can meet indoors or outdoors (example: conservation team meeting at Burrell's Ford) It is recommended that members should mask at indoor meetings.
- 2. <u>Chapter Large Groups:</u> No in-person Rabun chapter gatherings such as monthly meetings at this time.
- 3. <u>Meetings by Other Entities:</u> Individuals may participate in other group meeting sponsored by other entities, on behalf of Rabun TU (example: Conservation Chair attends State Council Meeting per that Rabun Chapter member's risk assessment and personal decision)

Phase II: Starting February 1, 2022

- 1. Chapter Small Group Meetings: Continue as above.
- 2. <u>Chapter Large group meetings:</u> Return to regular in-person monthly meetings. Will try to meet outdoors if possible, but will plan to return to indoor meetings.
- 3. <u>Chapter Events</u>: Will plan to resume Fly Fishing 101, Scout Picnic, Women's' Flyfishing Event, Picnic at Burrell's Ford, Family Picnic at Mud Creek, conservation projects, TU campouts.
- 4. Meetings by Others: Continue as above.

Rabun TU BOD will monitor changes in State and National TU guidelines and will modify these Chapter guidelines as appropriate.

We Need You to Help Combat Whirling Disease and IHNV in our North Georgia Trout Streams!!

Wash your boots and waders after each use. Use soapy water with 10% bleach applied to boots with a brush and then let dry in the sun is the best defense. Clean your waders with the soapy water and dry them as well. Whenever possible, swap your gear with a spare. (Sounds like we need to go to Reeves for an extra set of boots and waders for Christmas!)
