REMEMBER: as part of the event, each kid gets to go home with a fly rod and reel, ensuring that they will have the opportunity to continue to practice fly fishing! The organizers would really like for each participant to go home with a box of flies.

Prez Notes

Step Up!

I sure hope y'all are having a great spring. The flowers are blooming, the river bugs are hatching, and we are right here enjoying this wonderful season in the mountains! By the time you read this, we've hopefully rustled up enough volunteers to rally behind Justin and pull off a successful Reed Creek restoration project with state and federal partners. I recall being part of our first Rabunite cohort's efforts in the late 80's to repair the Double Bit Campsite and enhance its two creeks with instream structures. Those dams and deflectors are showing their age now and are certainly worthy of our Conservation Team's love. We should also be celebrating the Breithaupt's restoration of our Rabunite 101 outreach program. With their chapter helpers, a couple dozen flyfishing wannabe's will have learned the basics, got bitten by our shared affliction, and have a year of Rabun TU membership paid for. I do hope several of them decide that we are fun and hang around with us for a decade or three!

Looking ahead, we have lots of spring and summer opportunities for your fun and your assistance on worthy projects with our partners. Pat's awesome April newsletter had that long list of events detailed for y'all. And if I can point out just one event, you oughta try the spring campout. It's fishing, eating, lying (about catches), and fellowship. Get a little wood smoke on your britches and get a taste of our true chapter roots. Our founding members fished, fibbed, camped, ate, and drank. And soon decided to "give back" to their beloved trout waters by birthing the chapter and working beside the state and federal resource agency partners. Even if you can only show up for a day or just an evening meal and campfire fibs, it will be well worth the gas you burn.

Looking farther ahead, I'd like to suggest a chapter theme of "Step Up." I want each of you to consider how you can step up and be an active part of chapter success. We will have more opportunities for each chapter member to find his/her comfortable niche and contribute to our Rabunite cause. How? Lemme explain.

During 2019-2020 BC (Before Covid), the chapter Board, current Prez Kent, and I worked on a "model" for Rabunite Resurrection. We wanted to knock the dust off our traditional operations and find what interested current and prospective members. We looked at all possible duties/positions that TU-National and the GA Council hoped to see in each chapter (from the Excom's elected slots to advocacy to membership), ranked them in terms of Rabunite importance, and assessed our members' likely interest in filling those roles. In other words, what could we handle (our "carrying capacity" in this old biologist's terms)? Then we picked the highest ranking roles/duties and suggested a four –team approach to

achieving those program goals. Those four teams were the Excom, Team Conservation, Team Outreach and Education, and Team Fun and Fellowship.

The Excom was composed of us elected folks and maybe an interested Board member or two. We would handle the less romantic, but necessary tasks like membership, budgeting, advocacy, etc. Basically we'd do the admin stuff nobody else wanted to do and provide oversight and support to the three teams.

We envisioned the three other teams to each have a team leader, an assistant leader, and maybe ten members who volunteered to be within easy reach of team leaders. Of course, all chapter members will be welcomed to all activities, but those three core teams could get their activities planned, budgeted, and minimally staffed ahead of time, then ask for more help from the rest of us once plans were in place. Let me give you an idea of the events/ programs we envisioned for each team:

Conservation Team: examples include stream work projects with agency partners, assessment of complaints from members on environmental problems (ex: erosion and stream sedimentation), response to other resource agency needs/proposals beyond scheduled work projects, coordination with GA Council conservation director (currently Steve Westmoreland) on council topics (a good example is Tooga copter stocking). We were very fortunate for Steve Perry and Justin English to immediately volunteer as team leaders around Feb 2020 and begin to build their Conservation Team.

Outreach and Education Team: example chapter efforts include newsletter, social media, web page/webmaster, Project Healing Waters (wounded vets), Casting for Recovery (our gal friends), Womens Outreach (dear to Michelle's heart), youth education, Rabunite 101, and the annual scouts picnic.

Fun and Fellowship Team: examples are events coordination (ex: summer picnic, Xmas party), monthly meeting coordination, and the Rendezvous. This would be our member socialization crew.

So we had this big draft plan to roll out for y'all for spring 2020. Dangit, Covid hit and shut down nearly all of our operations, since they involved socialization. As we now hopefully emerge from those darker days, I wanted to put this draft operations model back on the Rabunite table. In February 2020, your BOD was just trying to shake 30 years of dust off our chapter operations and have some renewal. Now, after two years in our bomb shelters, the sun is shining and we are eager to reunite. And maybe do some good for the coldwater resource, the sport we love, and special friends whom we enjoy helping!

Please look this draft model over, share your thoughts with Tammy, the BOD, or me, and consider Stepping Up! Do you like this approach? Do you have some better ideas? We need your passion, your smiles, your brains, and maybe a little elbow grease. Tammy and I are fishing for leaders and assistants for the Outreach and Fun Teams, so step up. And those leaders will then fish for volunteers to fill out their team rosters. Step up. If we all work a little bit, then we can achieve a lot, just like our founders did in the 80's and 90's. And we will not burn out the 10-15 longtime members who "do it all, all the time." That's an unsustainable model for long term Rabunite success, and one that I hope we can all change soon.

Thanks to each of you for your efforts to date. Thanks to the fine folks who are already stepping up, like our wonderful nominees on our election slate. And thanks in advance to each of you for reading this, taking it to heart, and considering your own little niche in our Rabunite party, err Resurgence! It's gonna be grand and you sure don't wanna miss the fun and success to come!
