



Details: The Chapter will use Site #91 in the Wooded Loop as the "gathering spot". Meals will be taken there along with story telling around the campfire at night.



Campers should contact the <u>Park</u> and make their own campsite reservations. There are a variety of sites available, including sites with full hookups.

We will eat breakfast and supper together at Site #91. Lunch is on your own. We need volunteers to cook suppers and breakfasts beginning Wednesday April 26 through Sunday April 30 (except Friday supper).

If you volunteer to cook a meal then all other meals are free of charge to you. If you do not cook a meal, then you pay the cook \$5.00 for each meal that you eat. What a deal! The Chapter will provide stoves, paper plates, silverware, cups. Even if you don't camp, come by to eat a meal or sit around the campfire!

Friday night will be a communal steak and baked potato supper. Everyone bring your own steak and potato. The Chapter will have the grill and hot charcoal ready for you to grill your own steak!

We need an accurate head count of who will be at the campout and what meals you will eat. This is needed for the cooks to adequately purchase and prepare the meals.

On Thursday, April 27 we will travel to Upper Reed Creek and perform a stream conservation project in support of the US Forest Service and GA Department of Natural Resources.

Lewis Reeves III

On Wednesday took my dog for a walk and quick fishing trip to the Coleman River. Caught this 18" rainbow trout. I think he came up from the Tallulah River, he was caught probably 200 yards upstream from the bridge. I saw him rise but I caught him on a brown Rooster Tail spinner. It was my birthday—can't hardly beat that for a good birthday!

I made a quick trip to a catch and release river in North Carolina. It was a cool, cloudy day. I witnessed one of the best Blue Wing Olive hatches that I have ever seen. It lasted about 2 hours, but there was about 30 minutes when it was most awesome. The fish were rising everywhere. I wasn't prepared and didn't have a good fly pattern with me, but I did have a #16 Parachute Adams that I trimmed the hackles and tail. Hooked three, but landed just this one. It was a good day.

Pat and I went to a catch and release river in North Carolina for a day of fishing. The weather was perfect! It was warm and sunny and the water temperature was 50°. We saw lots of bugs hatching off, small grey mayflies and larger brown ones. I caught a big rainbow trout on a nymph; he took the fly as it swung downstream. It took me a long time to land the fish because I was using my 3 weight rod, but the fish was not hurt and it swam off just fine. I then left Pat and went up a small tributary stream. I caught two small rainbows on a Hen-





drickson dry fly that Pat had tied on for me. As I was working my way up the creek I saw a slightly deeper spot in the water along the far bank. I cast to it not expecting much, but wham! A big fish took it! I saw color on the fish and first thought it was a brook trout but as I fought it I saw it was a big brown trout! I landed it and took this picture. What fun!
