

Details: The Chapter will use Site #93 in the Wooded Loop as the "gathering spot". Meals will be taken there along with story telling around the campfire at night.

Campers should contact the <u>Park</u> and make their own campsite reservations. There are a variety of sites



available, including furnished cabins, tent only sites, and campsites with full hookups.

We will eat breakfast and supper together at Site #93. Lunch is on your own. We need volunteers to cook suppers and breakfasts (except Friday supper).

If you volunteer to cook a meal then all other meals are free of charge to you. If you do not cook a meal, then you pay the cook \$5.00 for each meal that you eat. What a deal! The Chapter will provide stoves, paper plates, silverware, cups. Even if you don't camp, come by to eat a meal or sit around the campfire!

Friday night will be a communal steak and baked potato supper. Everyone bring your own steak and potato. The Chapter will have the grill and hot charcoal ready for you to grill your own steak!



Off To A Good Start! By Nanette O'Hara

After a tough January where it seemed trout were only interested in junk flies or nymphs, my dry fly streak got back on track in February. I caught this pretty little rainbow, and several of his comrades, in wild trout waters in western NC on a #16 Blue-Winged Olive.

With a big coaching assist from Dredger, I also caught this fat stocker rainbow and several wild fish on another NC stream using pheasant tail and hares ear nymphs under an indicator.

My husband, Rick O'Hara, got a "2 for 1" special fishing a double-nymph rig under an indicator. A brown trout ate the top fly while a brookie gobbled the dropper. The winning combo was a Walt's worm and a France fly.

This past year Georgia TU Chapters participated in riparian habitat and stream restoration projects, organized and hosted Georgia Trout Camp, assisted educators with the Trout in the Classroom project, organized numerous fishing clinics for veterans, first responders, cancer survivors, and scouts, and supported high school and college trout fishing clubs in Georgia.
