

### TIP OF THE MONTH

While not a real tip the following is an observation by Jim "Nugget" Nixon. Jim shares this with all our readers in the hopes that they too will come to know and understand the peculiarities of trout. Jim says that not only do trout like to make fools of flyfishermen, they enjoy other games - like badminton! What you dear reader may have thought a splashy rise, was not that at all. Nugget notes that those trout having only one adipose fin are simply leaping over a hovering mayfly and batting it to another trout, who returns it in a like manner. The game ends when an unclipped trout joins in as that usually destroys the mayfly. We here in the Rabun Chapter are using this information to develope a hovering fly and once mastered, complete tying instructions will be shared as we do with all our information.
