All that was left to do was to dig into the banks through the rock and roots, wrestle the logs into their final position after clearing a good bed and pounding steel to hold them in place. Rocks filled in the structure. A silt fence was installed to reduce the amount of sediment washing down the campsite road and through the camp into the creek. Thanks to <u>Chris, Mike, Bill, Nugget, David, Francisco and Doug Watson</u>, it really does make a difference.
