Ecosystem Mgt./Stekoa Creek

As part of the Chattooga River Ecosystem Mangament Project, Rabun TU's Kyle Burrell will be heading up a field crew this summer that will conduct a biological survey of Stekoa Creek. Using a process known as Index of Biotic Integrity (IBI) the biological health of the creek will be determined. This study will help identify sources of pollution or stress within the watershed. This form of evaluation can help managers prioritize and implement plans for correction or improvement of these problems, ultimately furthering protection for the Chattooga River. A survey of this type was conducted last year and the stream was found to be in fair to poor condition. This will probably be an annual event, so lets all hope that in the years to come the stream will be evaluated as good to excellent. Anyone interested in the project give Kyle a call at 782-3320.

Kyle's Fly of the Month

It's July again and people are thinking about heading west to escape the humidity, rain, and gnats of our beautiful home state. Therefore this months fly has to be the mightiest gnat of all, the deadly Griffith's Gnat. Don't cross the state line without a dozen of these little guys. If you do, you'll be wondering why your vacation photos are scenes of sunsets and wildflowers instead of brown and rainbow trout. When you find yourself in the midst of a western "rise" where it seems every fish in the river is feeding on something but you can't figure out on what; it's time for the gnat. It looks like nothing but resembles everything. When a fish looks at it I don't think he knows exactly what it is, but since it's the right size he figures he'll eat it anyway. (Can a fish figure? Humm...)

Use stiff hackles and one strand of peacock. They're delicate little flies but since their so easy to make you can tie a dozen in about twenty minutes. So there's no reason not to stuff your boxes.

In the rivers, fish it dead drift directly over rising fish. Takes are very subtle so it takes a steady hand not to set the hook to hard or to fast. On lakes, you may want to give it a few twitches to attract a cruisers attention.

Hook: Mustad #94840 dry fly hook

Sizes 16, 18, 20 especially 16 Body: One strand peacock herl. Hackle: Good quality grizzly hackle

Look out WY, here we come!
