February 1995

Montana Stonefly Nyaph

Hook: 6 or 8 nymph hook; heavily weighted Thread: Black Hackle: Black Hen Body: Black Chenille or yarn Thorax: Yellow Chenille or yarn Wing Case: Same as body Tail: Black Hen Hackle Fibers

When fishing the colder months of January and February this fly, which imitates a pteronarcys nymph, combined with a small fly such as a #14 olive bead head caddis larva, provide trout an offer they can't refuse. Tie the Montana on as your point fly and tie in the smaller fly about 18" above it. This can be a potent combination as you are presenting the trout with two common food items of very different sizes. Fish the combination dead drift, slow and deep. Be alert, strikes are usually subtle during cold weather!

#### **Buffer Zone Is Still An Issue**

In the past couple of newsletters, there has been discussion on the buffer zone law that is currently on the books. As the law is currently written, trout streams are protected by a 100' buffer zone unless, under special circumstances, a variance is granted. Legislation is being introduced that will allow development to encroach to within 25' of a trout stream. The Chapter previously voted to support the established 100'. You need to let vour state representative know how you feel in regards to this issue. You may also want to contact the Governor at the State Capital.

1. Reviewed Rabun Rendezvous. Discussed revenue/expense figures. Decided more thought should be given to seating arrangement and to discontinue taking reservations of any kind. Put on a first come first served basis.

2. Work Projects and Outings: Moved date of Reed Creek Project to September to take advantage of lower water conditions. Again agreed to providing labor for the stream improvement project off Warwoman Road. Jim Kidd will coordinate this project. Voted to participate in Black Rock Mountain SP and Tallulah River "Kid's Fishing Dav" activities with both funds and manpower. Two outings, one at Kelly Picnic Grounds in July and the other a combination social/planning session at the Dillard House in December.

The Board developed the Activities Calendar, planning programs for forthcoming meetings. (Attached)

3. Allocated funds as follows: Black Rock Mountain SP Kid's Fishing \$150 Tallulah River Kid's Fishing **\$150** Helicoptor Stocking (Chattooga) \$ 400 Helicoptor Stocking (West Fork) \$ 300 Living Bright Water Trust (TU) **\$1000** General Fund (TU)

SE Regional Officer (TU) Will contribute a weekends accommodation at the Dillard House to both the Tailwater Chapter and Foothills Chapter banquet efforts.


Also agreed to fund complimentary memberships in TU to members of the Foxfire Boys and to contribute 50% of the membership fee in TU for the interested enviornmental studies students at Rabun County High School and Rabun Gap Nacoochee School.

Along these lines, the Board agreed to mount a strong effort to engage the youth of the area in cold water resource concerns. We will develop a video in that effort and try to involve the young people in some of our work projects.
