# Caddis Pupa

Hook: #16 Dry or Wet Body: Light Olive and Cream antron mixed Hackle: Pheasant, very

sparse

Thorax:Peacock herl
Thread: Olive

Have you ever been fishing during a caddis hatch and been frustrated because the trout refused the fly? That's because the trout are most likely focusing on the emerging pupa. Tie this simple pattern on a trailer 18" behind an elk hair caddis. It's a deadly combo for April fishing.
