


Opportunities For Your Comments On The Chattahoochee National Forest Plan Revision

Forest Service Appoints New Chief

On January 6th, Mike Dombeck became the 14th Chief of the US Forest Service, and its first chief who is a fisheries biologist. Bits and Pieces

New Release: The Ketchum release is a new product that is being marketed as a piece of tackle that is good for both the angler and the fish. The release tool removes the hook without having to net or touch the fish and it is easy on the fly. It is available from The Waterworks, Dept. SA, POB 539, Ketchum, ID 83340; 1-800-4fly-fsh.

Boat Box: Mount Sierra Crest's Lifetime Boat Box on a float tube to keep flies within easy reach. The box can be left open so flies dry off without blowing away, and incorporates a high-tech liner that won't tear or hold moisture. The lid is lined with "bristle-tack" for holding flies up to size 2 and the bottom is lined with loop tack, for larger streamer, bass or saltwater hooks. Comes in large (4x8) and medium (35/8 x 51/2 inches). It can be ordered from Sierra Pacific Products, Dept. SA, PO Box 276833, Sacramento, CA 95827; 916-369-1146.
