Those of you that have worked on Reed Creek over the years would have appreciated how well the structures have held up and how great they blend in with the surrounding habitat.

One mid stream cover log was pinned in; rock was piled in and around some existing deflectors; rhododendrum were hinged and positioned in the stream to catch debris, creating food factories;

and, a couple of logs were repositioned.

While the stream is not the easiest to fish, forget double hauling, it is a great nursery and rearing ground for some mighty beautiful Brown Trout

White River National Forest's Trout Streams Under Attack Take Action Now!

The future of Colorado's prized trout fisheries and the ecosystems that sustain them..including the Blue, Eagle, Frying Pan, and Roaring Fork rivers...will be seriously compromised if developers and Colorado politicians are allowed to rewrite the White River National Forest Plan, scheduled to conclude its public comment period May 9, 2000. The U. S. Forest Service's White River draft management plan has become the target of opposition from interests anxious to drain even more water out of the already stressed river system.

Because the White River's management plan is the first* of many plans for major forests that will affect the nation's fisheries, it is important to make a stand now. The White River is the country's fourth largest forest, and in the top five for recreational use. If we can't protect streams on the White River we may not be able to protect them anywhere else in the nation.

TAKE ACTION NOW by urging the Forest Service to reassert its duty to monitor and maintain the flows needed to sustain healthy trout fisheries. With just a click of a button and a minute of your time, you can send a strong message in support of the Forest Service's draft management plan as part of the official comment period.
