Island Park Special...easy to tie...trout love it!

Hook: #14 Nymph hook Bead: Gold

Thread: Black

Rib: Fine gold or copper wire

Hackle: Good quality Brown palmered Body: Peacock Herl

- 1 Mash barb and slide on bead
- 2 Secure hook, slide bead to the bend, build thread base for the bead and tie off.
- 3 Slide bead back to eye of hook.
- 4 Tie in thread, forming a base to

bend of the hook.

- 5 Tie in copper wire at bend
- 6 Tie in hackle at bend
- 7 Tie in two to three peacock herls at the bend and wrap to just short of the bead head.
- 8 Take four or five wraps of the copper wire to the bead.
- 9 Palmer the hackle to just behind the bead, tie off securely and cement.
