NEWS FROM THE FOREST.....

If you have an opinion, the Forest Service would like to hear from you regarding the use of all terrain vehicles (ATV) on National Forest System Roads. For the past ten years, ATV use in Georgia has been limited to designated off road vehicle trails (when enforced) within the Chattahoochee or Oconee National Forests or on public roads when the vehicles are properly licensed. There are 15 trail systems for off road vehicles totaling 133 miles. Until last year, the Georgia Department of Revenue-Motor Vehicle Division allowed those counties who wished to issue a tag to ATV owners to do so. On March 23, 2000, the Motor Vehicle Division issued a letter to all county commissioners saying no more tags could be issued or renewed for ATVs. Along with the question legality, there are other issues that need to be addressed concerning ATV use on forest roads. These include: the impacts of the increased use of ATVs on the roads, the impacts to the natural resources in the forest, and the question of safety of ATV riders and others. TIPPET AND FLIES FOR THE FALL

Cool temperatures, gin-clear streams and low water levels require a more careful approach when fishing this time of the year. Try 6X or even 7X tippets,
