

Introduction to Matt Kulp

Matt Kulp holds a B.S. in biology from Pennsylvania State University (1992) and a M.S. in biology (fisheries) from Tennessee Technological University (1994). He worked at the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) Cooperative Fisheries Research Unit at Penn State in 1993-1994 as a fisheries technician. Matt began his career with Great Smoky Mountains National Park (GRSM) in May 1994 as a fishery technician, in May 1995 became a fishery biologist and in 2014 became the Supervisory Fishery Biologist at the Park. His fisheries management objectives focus on fish population monitoring, Brook Trout genetics, native fish restoration, threatened and endangered fish reintroduction and monitoring, and longterm water quality monitoring/modelling. He has led or assisted with native fish restoration projects in 5 national parks, 3 National Forests and one USFWS wildlife refuge restoring Bull Trout, Bonneville Cutthroat Trout, Rio Grande Cutthroat Trout, southern Brook Trout, Barren's Topminnow, and native amphibians. In GRSM, he assisted or led projects to restore Brook Trout to 19 streams totaling 36.5 miles of habitat. Matt authored or coauthored over 35 peer reviewed publications covering fisheries management, Brook Trout genetics, water quality, biotic effects of acidification and native fish restoration. Matt was awarded the EPA STAR award for coauthoring "Standard Operating Practices for the Use of Fintrol® (Antimycin A) for Restoration of Native Fish Populations". When not working he enjoys turkey hunting, fishing, woodworking and spending time with his wife Mimi. They reside in Wears Valley, Tennessee.

A Review of the Chapter Annual Report to National TU Tammy Hopton, Chapter Prez

Each year every TU Chapter must give an annual report to National TU stating their accomplishments for the fiscal year ending April 31. This yearly report helps us see where our money and time is spent. Let me tell you, it can be a challenge to pull all the numbers together to get it close to accurate. We couldn't do it without Ray King!

Here is a summary of some of our accomplishments with a comparison to last year's numbers:

Conservation Events: 15 events for this year vs 3 the prior year. This year includes the monthly Reed Creek cleanups, the Hale Ridge project, and the Reed Creek stream improvement project.

Conservation Hours: 73 hours this year vs 25 hours for the prior year (see above).

College related events: 3 this year and none last year These included the Chattooga River cleanup with GA Tech 5 Rivers Club, the UGA 5 River ladies campout and fishing event, and the Reed Creek Stream improvement project with the UGA recreation class.

Advocacy Hours: 68 Hours this year vs 4 hours last year. This included the Leadership Georgia visit to Rabun County in September.

Of course, this is just a brief overview. We also had campouts, helped with electroshocking on the Chattooga River, monitored water temperature of the Chattooga River, and helped with Tallulah River Kids Fishing Rodeo. We also supported many other organizations financially, such as Casting for Recovery, Project Healing Water and the Georgia Wildlife Federation.

So let's give a big "thank you!" to our chapter leaders of these events. I wanted to share this year's accomplishments with you so you can see what a fun, active Chapter you belong to. You can be proud of the Rabun Chapter TU!
